SHOW & TRANSPORT

Sun 27 – Mon 28 August: 11am, 1.30pm & 4pm

Starts at Bagshaw Museum, Woodlands Road, Wilton Park, WF17 0AS

You will then follow the action down through Wilton Park, finishing near the play area at the bottom of the park.

Bus Information:

Buses 229, 281 and 283 all stop by the bottom entrance to the park.

The stop on the same side of the road as the park is Stop No 450 12423 for buses travelling towards Batley, Dewsbury and Heckmondwike.

The stop on opposite side of the road is Stop No 450 12422 for buses travelling towards Birstall and Birkenshaw.

ARRIVAL & PARKING

Arrival:

The show starts at Bagshaw Museum at the top of the park. It takes about 20 minutes to walk from the bottom of the park to the Museum; the map on the next page shows the easiest route but this is all still uphill. Please arrive at least 20 minutes before the start of the show so that you have enough time to collect your headset.

So if you are coming from the bottom of the park allow 40 minutes in total to walk to the Museum and collect your headset.

Parking:

There is a carpark at the bottom of the park close to the lake and the play area and at Bagshaw Museum, but these both fill up very quickly and are likely to be busy on the Bank Holiday weekend.

HOW THE SHOW WORKS

This is a walking show, meaning that you will be following a route through the woods and will not be sitting down.

When you arrive you will be given a set of headphones to wear – this is how you will hear the actors and all the music in the show and you will need to wear your headphones all the time. The headphones are designed for adults and children – but if you have young children (under 3 years old) they may be too big.

You will be led by the performers through the woods. There are points where you will stop to watch the action, but there isn't anywhere to sit down at these points – please do not bring your own chairs you WILL NOT be able to use them.

The places you will be walking will be over uneven ground, some places there isn't a path and if it has been raining then there will be mud.

ACCESSIBILITY

There are some cold drinks available from Bagshaw Museum before the show starts – but please allow plenty of time as there may be a queue.

There is a café at the bottom of the park which will be open 10am-5pm that sells tea, coffee, cold drinks and some snacks.

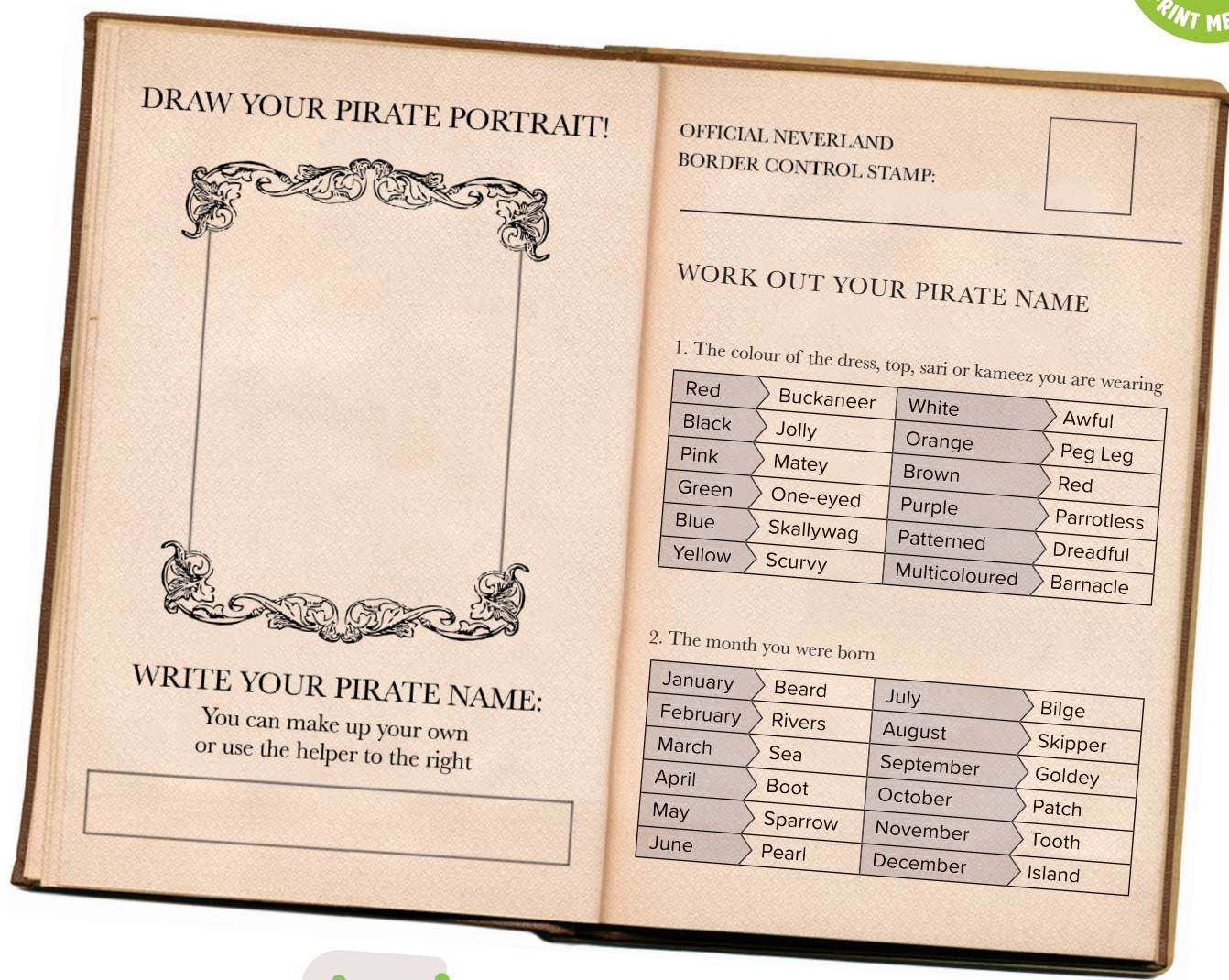
Will toilets be available?
